Four Essential Components

2. Establishing a video source such as a DVD player or VCR. The latter is starting to get a little outdated so a DVD player should be your first choice. A VCR should be added only if you still have that old collection of movies you built up during the 1980s.
3. Good sound reproduction ability in the shape of an audio decoder. Surround sound is almost required in today's environment especially if you want true cinema sound bouncing off the walls of your room.
4. Good quality speakers are the final component of your show piece. How many speakers do you need? This can be debated ad infinitum but it really depends on the size of your room. Minimum of three up to six and of course, a sub-woofer.

These are just the basics and in time, accessories such as home theater chairs, pop corn machines and paraphernalia adorning the walls will complete your project. But there is no need to be in a rush as this type of project should be an ongoing one for the first few months.

Getting good home theater ideas is as easy as visiting your local showroom such as Best Buy. Display areas dedicated to home entertainment are also a haven for ideas and don't just visit one; visit as many as you can.

Other considerations will obviously come into play and one of those will be budget. That's why if you are on a restricted budget then there is no harm in treating this as an ongoing project.
